A HUGE thank you to all of the sponsors and participants for their continued, amazing support and for their courage to literally reach for the heights to achieve success!

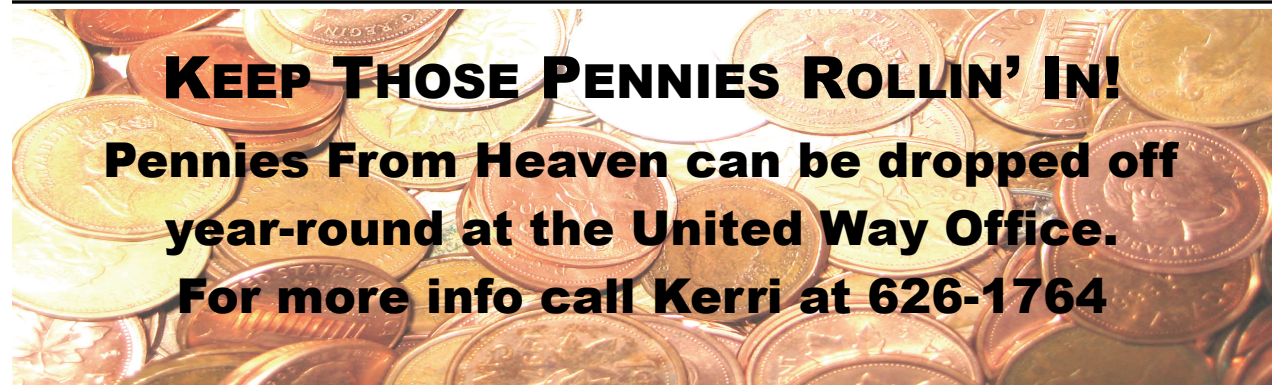

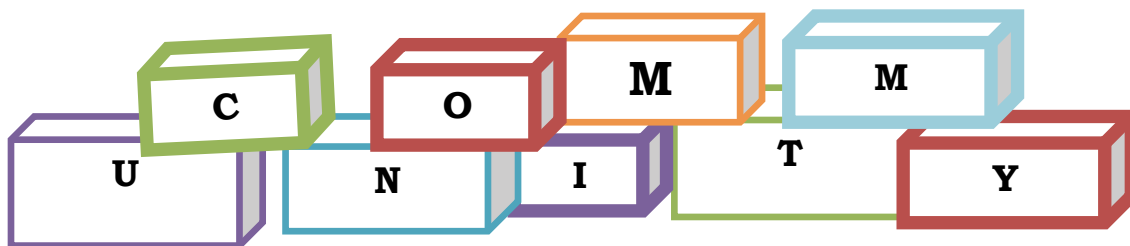
